The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Lessser volume of fresh marine commodities were reported this week. This may be attributed to the occurrence of bright moon which affects the fishing activity of the fishermen, wherein fishes tend to go deeper making them hard to catch and the presence of Low-Pressure Area (LPA) in the eastern part of Davao City. Nonetheless, fresh marine commodities like talakitok, espada, dalagang bilog, lapad, tulingang bilog, labahita, tanigue, sapsap, maya-maya, lapung itim, tawilis, tamban, tambakol, gulyasan, pompano itim, salay batang, pusit bisaya, pusit haba, banak, pugita, and others continue to be available at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
- 2. For local-fresh galunggong, sufficient supplies were still noted at the Navotas Fish Port this week. This resulted to a low prevailing wholesale price of Php130.00/kg. According to the data gathered, all sizes were available and sourced mostly from Northern Palawan and Zambales.
- $3.\,\mathrm{Same}$ prevailing wholesale price were observed for imported-frozen galunggong at Php130.00/kg this week. Due to the abundant supply of local galunggong, low volume of imported galunggong was recorded at the Fish Port sourced from China. 4. No changes were observed in the prevailing wholesale prices for aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia at Php120-140/kg and Php100.00/kg due to the sufficient supplies at the fish port. Supplies were still sourced from Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Batangas, respectively.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan, Pangasinan
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China

6. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of April 26 & May 3, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
