

## The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. At Navotas Fish Port 1 & 2 (wholesale), sufficient unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed this week. This could be due to the fairweather conditions in the country. More specifically, for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), supplies chiefly sourced from Northern Palawan were stable in the fish port. The recorded prevailing wholesale price was at Php160.00/kg (13-15pcs/kg) on 9 May 2023. Other marine commodities recorded include dilis, pusit, gulyasan, betilla, talakitok, bisugo, dalagang bukid, labahita, bolador, tamban, kabase, and others.
- 2. Due to the existing demand for imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, unloading of the commodity remained observed at the fish port this week. Ten (10) brokers unloaded the imported-frozen galunggong from China with stable prevailing wholesale price of Php130.00/kg.
- 3. Supplies of medium-sized alumahan continued to be unpredictable as no unloading of the commodity was still observed this week.
- 4. No changes were recorded in the prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized bangus chiefly sourced from Bulacan at Php135.00/kg this week. The unchanged prevailing prices may be attributed to the steady supply and demand of the commodity for the consuming public.
- 5. Lastly, for medium-sized tilapia, all of the supplies available were still from Batangas, as supplies from Pampanga remained minimal. This may be due to the increase in the price of feed mill as reported from region 3, wherein the producers opted to stop or reduce their operation until their profit margins are acceptable for them.
- $6. \ Top \ fishery \ commodities \ in \ the \ monitored \ markets \ are \ sourced \ mainly \ from \ the \ following \ are as:$
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia -Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- Not available
- e. Imported galunggong China

Note: Wholesale price data is as of May 9, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.

(\*\*) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
