The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of April:

1. Ample supplies of fresh-marine commodities were reported at Navotas fish port this month. More specifically, abundant supplies of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), as well as its other variants (balsa and burot), was noted. Supplies unloaded were mainly sourced from Northern Palawan, Zambales, and Batangas.

2. Unloadings of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was still noted at the Navotas Fish Port throughout the month sourced from China. The recorded prevailing wholesale price remained unchanged at Php130.00/kg. This may be due to the steady supply and demand of the commodity in the fish port.

3. For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), supplies continued to be sufficient to cater the demand of the buying public. Majority of the supplies of medium-sized bangus were sourced from Bulacan and Pangasinan. Meanwhile, supplies of medium-sized tilapia were chiefly derived from Batangas.
