The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Minimal supplies of fresh marine commodities chiefly sourced from Palawan and Zambales were available at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week as Southwest monsoon continues to bring cold weather conditions that affect most part of the country. Also, the inclement weather condition brought about by the effect of Typhoon "Betty" in the country contributed to the decrease of unloaded supplies this week.
- 2. Despite the effects of Typhoon "Betty", the supplies of local-fresh galunggong continues to be adequate at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php140.00/kg this week. Other local galunggong variants like "Balsa" (Decapterus macarellus), "Burot" (Decapterus kurroides) and "Babae" (Decapterus russelli) were also
- 3. For imported-frozen galunggong, the prevailing wholesale price of the commodity was at Php120.00/kg imported from China. There is still low demand for imported-frozen galunggong due to the adequate supply of local-fresh galunggong which is more prefered by consumers.
- 4. No changes were noted in prevailing wholesale prices of aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia) at Php130/kg and Php95.00/kg this week due to the sufficient and stable supplies at the fish port. Supplies were still sourced from Bulacan and Batangas, respectively.
- 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus Bulacan
 - b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China
- 6. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of May 28, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
