

## The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Minimal but sufficient displays of fresh marine commodities (i.e., balsa, tambakol, tamban, bisugo, dalagang bukid, matambaka, tulingan, espada, salay ginto, etc.) were recorded at Navotas Fish Port 3, 4, & 5 this week. This could be the result of the hampered fishing operations brought by the Southwest monsoon and Low-Pressure Area (LPA) in the east of Eastern Visayas.
- 2. Ample supplies for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong were unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week despite heavy rain weather condition this week. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php140.00/kg this week. There were other local galunggong variants like "Balsa" (Decapterus macarellus), "Burot" (Decapterus kurroides) and "Babae " (Decapterus russelli) were also recorded.
- 3. There is still low demand for imported-frozen galunggong due to adequate supply of local-fresh galunggong which is more prefered by consumers. The prevailing wholesale price of the commodity was at Php120.00/kg and Php130.00/kg imported from China.

## Remarks/Market Observations:

- 4. Same prevailing wholesale prices were recorded for aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia) at Php130.00/kg and Php100.00/kg this week due to the sufficient and stable supplies at the fish port. Supplies were still sourced mainly from Bulacan and Batangas, respectively.
- 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China
- 6. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among
