## The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Limited unloading of fresh marine fishery commodities was noted at Navotas Fish Port this week. This may be due to the constant inclement weather conditions in the country.
- 2. There a slight increase in the prevailing wholesale price of local-fresh galunggong due to the rainy weather season brought by Typhoon "Egay" which hampers fishing operations throughout the whole country. Minimal supply of other galunggong variant like "balsa" (Decapterus macarellus), "Burot" (Decapterus kurroides) and "Babae" (Decapterus russelli) were observed.
- 3. Supply of imported-frozen galunggong increased in the Navotas Fish Port relative to the low supply of local-fresh galunggong. According to vendors, higher demand were observed for imported-frozen galunggong this week. The prevailing wholesale price of the commodity was at Php130.00/kg imported from Vietnam.

## Remarks/Market Observations:

- 4. The prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia remained at Php130.00/kg and Php95.00/kg due to the stable and sufficient supplies at the Navotas Fish Port. Bulacan and Batangas were still the major source area for both commodities.
- 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China
- 6. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
