The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Still, limited unloading of marine fishery commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. This may be attributed to the hampered fishing operation brought about by the unfavorable weather condition in country.
- 2. More specifically, for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), only three (3) brokers on 25 July 2023 and four (4) brokers on 28 July 2023 unloaded the commodity sourced from Palawan and Zambales.
- 3. For medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, supplies remained ample and steady at the fish port this week. This may be due to the steady demand of the imported galunggong in the fish port.
- 4. Meanwhile, there continues to be no unloadings of alumahan was recorded this week at the fish port.
- 5. For medium-sized bangus from Bulacan, supplies were still adequate this week. Alongside, supplies of small and large-sized bangus were also recorded at the fish port obtained from Pangasinan and Bulacan.
- 6. Lastly, for medium-sized tilapia, supplies were still observed to be sufficient at the fish port this week. However, minimal increased in price for the commodity coming from Batangas was recorded that could be the effect of fish kill in Taal lake.
- 7. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia -Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- Not available
- e. Imported galunggong Vietnam
- (-) Price and Volume not available during price monitoring

**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market.
