Sufficient supplies of marine fishery commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be due to the fair-weather condition compared from previous week wherein typhoons affected the fishing operations of fisherfolks. 2. For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), high prevailing wholesale price were still recorded this week. Only two (2) brokers unloaded at the fish port from Northern Palawan with an actual wholesale price of Php100.00/kg (14-20pcs/kg) and Php180.00/kg (10-15pcs/kg). On 11 August five (5) brokers with a recorded wholesale price of Php180.00/kg. 3. Supplies of imported-frozen galunggong continues to be available at Navotas Fish Port. According to vendors, lower **Remarks/Market Observations:** demand were observed compared from previous weeks due to the increase in the supply of local galunggong. The prevailing wholesale price of the commodity was at Php135 & 140/kg imported from Vietnam. 4. No changes were noted in the prevailing retail price of bangus and tilapia at Php135 & 140/kg and Php105 & 110/kg. This may be due to the stable and sufficient supplies at the Navotas Fish Port. 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: a. Bangus - Bulacan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan d. Alumahan- NA Imnorted galunggong - Vietnam (-) - Price and Volume not available during price monitoring \*\*) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring. NA- Source Area not available during price monitoring

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
