The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. At Navotas Fish Port, sufficient unloading of fresh marine commodities were unloaded this week. More specifically, for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), ample volume of supplies chiefly obtained from Palawan were noted. Difference in prices may be attributed to the varying sizes of the supplies as bigger sizes command higher price in the market.
- 2. For medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, supplies imported from Vietnam was still available at the fish port this week.
- 3. For medium-sized alumahan, supplies continued to be unpredictable as no supplies of the commodity was recorded throughout the week.
- 4. For medium-sized bangus, most of the supplies available at Navotas Fish Port were from Bulacan while supplies from Pangasinan were dominantly large (1-2pcs/kg). The recorded prevailing wholesale price of bangus from Bulacan were Php145.00/kg on 15 August and Php140.00/kg on 18 August this week. Price change could be due to the difference in sizes of supplies.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 5. For medium-sized tilapia, most of the supplies were still sourced from Batangas this week. This might be due to the consumers' demand, as the majority prefers tilapia from Batangas due to better quality (in terms of taste and appearance). The recorded wholesale prices were Php120.00/kg on 15 August and Php115.00/kg on 18 August.
- 6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia -Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- Not available
- e. Imported galunggong Vietnam
