Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Minimal volume of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Commodities recorded were betilla, olupot, dalagang bukid, biluan, batalay, sague, lapad, alakaak, tambakol, gulyasan, and others. Meanwhile, unloading of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki was still observed in the fish port. Display of small and large size galunggong were also noted. Supply of the commodity was chiefly sourced from Zambales.
- For medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, sufficient availability was also observed at the fish port this week.
- For alumahan, no supply was recorded.
- For bangus and tilapia, supply remained available and sufficient to cater to the demand of the buying public. In connection, supplies of medium-sized bangus were recorded this week sourced from Pangasinan and Bulacan.
- Lastly, for medium-sized tilapia, most of the supplies at Navotas fish port this week were still derived from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong - Zambales
 - Alumahan - Not Available
 - Imported galunggong - China

(-) - Price and Volume not available during price monitoring

(**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
