The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. A minimal but sufficient supply of fresh marine commodities (i.e., samaral, tanigue, balsa, tamban, matambaka, dorado, batalay, gulyasan, etc.,) was observed at Navotas Fish Port and among the monitored retail markets this week.
- 2. Minimal volume of supplies for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were still unloaded at the fish port this week. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php160.00/kg. Other local variants like galunggong "balsa" and "burot" were observed.
- 3. Availability of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was reported on 7 November at Php145.00/kg. Supplies were chiefly imported from China.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 4. For medium-sized bangus and tilapia, steady and adequate supplies were still reported at Navotas Fish Port this week. Price differences might possibly be due to the varying sizes of the commodity. Nonetheless, only large-sized bangus from Pangasinan was reported in the fish port this week.
- 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan
- b. Tilapia Batangas, Pampanga
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China

(**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market.

This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
