Minimal but still sufficient display of fresh marine commodities was noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) and in monitored markets today. Commodities recorded were dalagang-bukid bilog, balsa, labahita, tanigue, maya-maya, dorado, gulyasan, bitilya, saramulyete, and others. 2. Limited volume of supplies for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma) were still unloaded at the fish port this week. This may be attributed to the ongoing Closed Fishing Season for galunggong in Northern Palawan that commenced on November 1, 2023, and is scheduled to conclude on January 31, 2024. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php170 & 180/kg. There are other local variants like galunggong "balsa" and "burot" were observed. 3. Higher volume of supplies for imported-frozen galunggong were observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. The **Remarks/Market Observations:** prevailing wholesale price remained at Php130.00/kg. Certificate of Necessity to Import 35,000MT of frozen roundscad, mackerel, bonito and moonfish for wet markets was signed by the DA on August 19 2023 and shall only be valid from October 1 to December 31, 2023. 4. No changes were observed in the prevailing wholesale price of both medium-sized bangus and tilapia. The wholesale prices remained stable at Php140.00/kg and Php120.00/kg, respectively. Supplies were sourced mainly from Bulacan and Batangas this week. This may be attributed to the sufficient and stable supplies at the market. 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: a. Bangus - Bulacan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Local galunggong- Zambales d. Alumahan- NA Imported galunggong - China (-) - Price and Volume not available during price monitoring

(**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market.

This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
