The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. Generally, minimal unloading of fresh marine fishery commodities was noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), supply from Zambales was reported with a prevailing wholesale price of Php180.00/kg. 2. Availability of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong was still noted at the fish port this week sourced from Vietnam.

- 3. Meanwhile, minimal unloading of alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*) was observed at the fish port this week. Supply available was mainly from Masbate.
- 4. Steady and adequate volume of bangus and tilapia were observed at the fish port this week. Specifically, for medium-sized bangus, the recorded prevailing wholesale price was Php135.00/kg, all were sourced from Bulacan. Also, large-sized bangus sourced from Pangasinan was available at the fish port. Sufficient availability of medium-sized tilapia was reported at Navotas Fish Port this week. The recorded prevailing wholesale price
- was at Php100.00/kg. Supply were chiefly from Batangas.

 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus -Bulacan
 - b. Tilapia Batangas
 - c. Local Galunggong- Zambales
 - d. Alumahan- Masbate
 - e. Imported galunggong Vietnam
- (-) Price and Volume not available during price monitoring

Remarks/Market Observations:

(**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
