Remarks/Market Observations:		<ol> <li>Lower volume of supplies of fresh marine commodities (i.e., talangka, salay batang, lapad, matambaka, dalgang bukid, gulyasan, batalay, espada, etc.) was noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.</li> <li>For local-fresh galunggong (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>), lesser supplies were still unloaded at the fish port this week. This may be due to the implementation Closed Fishing Season for local galunggong in Northern Palawan on November 1 to January 31. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php160.00/kg. There are other local variants like galunggong "balsa" and "burot" were observed.</li> <li>More volume of supplies for imported-frozen galunggong were observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php130.00/kg. Supplies were imported from China and Vietnam. The constant availability of imported-frozen galunggong might possibly be due to minimal volume of local-galunggong variants caused by the prohibition of catching, selling, and buying of galunggong in Northern Palawan (major fishing ground).</li> <li>The prevailing wholesale price of both medium-sized bangus and tilapia remained stable at Php130.00-150.00/kg and Php100.00/kg, respectively. This may be attributed to the sufficient supplies unloaded at the said fish port.</li> <li>Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:         <ul> <li>Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan</li> <li>Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga</li> <li>Local galunggong - Zambales, Palawan</li> <li>Alumahan - Masbate</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
