Remarks/Market Observations:		The following observations were gathered from market personnel: 1. Generally, sufficient volume of marine fishery commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Commodities recorded were labahita, dalagang bukid, talakitok, gulyasan, tambakol, lapad, malakapas, and others. 2. More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong ( <i>Decapterus macrosoma</i> ) minimal unloadings sourced from Zambales and Mindoro were noted at Navotas Fish Port this week. This may be attributed to the ongoing Closed Fishing Season for local galunggong in Northern Palawan (major fishing ground). The prevailing wholesale price was at Php160-180/kg. There are other local variants like galunggong "balsa" and "burot" were observed. 3. Supplies of imported-frozen galunggong continued to be available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php130.00/kg. Supplies were imported from Vietnam and China. 4. Same prevailing wholesale prices were noted for both medium-sized bangus and tilapia at Php140.00/kg and Php100- 110/kg, respectively. Supplies remained stable and sufficient at the said fish port. 5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: a. Bangus - Bulacan b. Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga c. Local galunggong - Zambales, Mindoro d. Alumahan- NA e. Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
