Remarks/Market Observations:		 Minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. This could be due to the unfavorable weather conditions brought about by the shear line affecting the eastern section of Southern Luzon and Northeast Monsoon (Amihan) in parts of the Northern and Central Luzon as reported by PAGASA. Relatively, minimal unloading of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>) was still recorded in the fish port sourced from Zambales, Mindoro, and Zamboanga. On the other hand, availability of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki continued to be adequate at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week to augment the supply of its local variant. Meanwhile, no unloading of medium-sized alumahan (<i>Rastrelliger kanagurta</i>), was still observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. For medium-sized bangus (<i>Chanos chanos</i>), adequate volume was still reported at Navotas Fish Port this week. Additionally, medium-sized bangus from Pangasinan usually commands a higher price as compared to medium-sized bangus from Bulacan. One possible reason could be due to the higher consumer demand in the supplies coming from Pangasinan than those supply in Bulacan. For medium-sized tilapia (<i>Oreochromis niloticus</i>), most supplies were still from Batangas. It appears that majority of the consumers prefer the said commodity from Batangas over those sourced from Pampanga.
