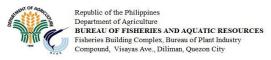

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. At Navotas Fish Port, minimal unloading of marine fishery commodities were observed at this week. More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*), limited unloadings sourced from Zamboanga, Zambales and Southern Palawan were noted at Navotas Fish Port this week. This may be attributed to the ongoing Closed Fishing Season for local galunggong in Northern Palawan (major fishing ground). The prevailing wholesale price was at Php200.00/kg.
- 2. According to fish vendors, higher demand for imported-frozen galunggong were noted at the fish port as local galunggong continued to be limited. Imported-frozen galunggong serves as a substitute commodity for local galunggong. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong is at Php130 & 132/kg sourced from China.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 3. No changes were noted in the prevailing wholesale price of bangus and tilapia at Php120-155/kg and Php90 & 100/kg this week. This may be due to the sufficient and stable supply at the said fish port.
- 4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan, Pangasinan
- b. Tilapia Batangas, Pampanga
- c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Zamboanga, Southern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- NA
- e. Imported galunggong China
- (-) Price and Volume not available during price monitoring
- (**) Actual Price price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
