Remarks/Market Observations:		<ol> <li>Generally, minimal unloading of marine fishery commodities was observed in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This might be affected the occurrence of a full moon on 25 January 2024, wherein fishes tend to go deeper making them hard to catch. For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>), four (4) brokers unloaded the commodity on January 23 and 25, 2024 at sustained prevailing wholesale price of Php200.00/kg. Said supplies were obtained from Zambales and Mindoro.</li> <li>Supplies of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki continued to be observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. Supplies were derived from China and Vietnam.</li> <li>No unloading of medium-sized alumahan (<i>Rastrelliger kanagurta</i>) was also recorded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.</li> <li>On the contrary, a sufficient volume of medium-sized bangus (<i>Chanos chanos</i>) from Bulacan and Pangasinan was observed this week. However, the majority of the supplies remained large in size (1-2pcs/kg).</li> <li>Lastly, for medium-sized tilapia (<i>Oreochromis niloticus</i>), most of the supplies at Navotas fish port were still from Batangas due to higher dema and better quality (in terms of taste). Also, as observed, supplies from Batangas were usually uniform in size as compared with supplies from Pampanga that is usually mixed sizes (3-6pcs/kg). Nevertheless, the recorded prevailing wholesale price remained unchanged at Php100.00/kg this week.
