

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. At Navotas Fish Port, an adequate unloading of marine fishery commodities was observed this week. Different varieties of commodities recorded were bisugo, torcillo, gulyasan, lapad, dalagang bukid, tambakol, silinyase, and others. More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong (Decapterus macrosoma), sufficient supplies sourced from Palawan and Zambales were noted at the fish port. The recorded prevailing wholesale price was stable at Php160 and 180.00/kg.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 2. For imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (D. macrosoma) continuous supply was still notable at Navotas Fish Port, imported from China and Vietnam. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (D. macrosoma) was Php130.00/kg, while for galunggong babae (D. russelli) the recorded actual price was Php80.00 and Php83.00/kg.
- 3. For aquaculture commodities such as bangus (Chanos chanos) and tilapia (Oreochromis niloticus), supplies continued to be sufficient for the consuming public.
- 4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus Bulacan, Pangasinan
- b. Tilapia Batangas, Pampanga
- c. Local galunggong- Palawan and Zambales
- e. Imported galunggong China and Vietnam
