The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. Minimal but still adequate unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More specifically, for local fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), supplies sourced from Zambales, Mindoro, and Palawan were available.

2. Despite the constant availability of local variants, supplies of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki from Vietnam were observed at Navotas Fish Port this week at a prevailing wholesale price of Php130.00/kg. Supply of imported-frozen galunggong babae was also noted at the fish port.

3. For alumahan (Rastrelliger kanagurta), supplies remained unpredictable as only one (1) broker unloaded the commodity at the fish port with an actual wholesale price of Php220.00/kg sourced from Masbate Province.

4. For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), adequate unloading was still observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. Specifically, for bangus (*Chanos chanos*), supplies available were derived from Bulacan and Pangasinan. Nonetheless, it was observed that supplies from Pangasinan command a better price compared to Bulacan due to difference in quality (in terms of size and taste).
5. For tilapia, supplies at the fish port were mostly from Batangas. This might be due to the consumer's demand, as majority of the consumers/

buyers prefer tilapia from Batangas over Pampanga due to better quality (in terms of taste).

- 6. Major source areas of the top fishery commodities in the monitored wholesale market are as follows:
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Zambales
- d. Alumahan- Masbate
- e. Imported galunggong Vietnam
