Remarks/Market Observations:		<ol> <li>Sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.</li> <li>For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>), adequate supplies were still unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port sourced from Northern Palawan and Zambales this week. Most of the supplies available were small to medium in siz The prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized local galunggong was at relatively low price of Php130.00 &amp; 140.00/kg. Other variant of local galunggong like burot (<i>Decapterus kurroides</i>) and balsa (<i>Decapterus macarellus</i>) were also reporte 3. There were still supply of imported-frozen galunggong available at the Navotas Fish Port despite the ample supply of local galunggong this week. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong was at Php130.00/kg sourced from Vietnam and China.</li> <li>No changes were noted in the prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia at Php120.00/kg and Php90.00/kg, respectively, this week. This may be attributed to the adequate and stable supply at the said fish port.</li> <li>Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:         <ul> <li>a.
