Remarks/Market Observations:		<ul> <li>The following observations were gathered from market personnel:</li> <li>1. Sufficient supplies of fresh marine commodities were still observed at the Navotas Fish Port Complex (wholesale) this week. Consequently, ample unloading of local fresh galunggong lalaki (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>) was noted, sourced from Mindoro, Zambales, and Palawan.</li> <li>2. Supply of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (<i>D. macrosoma</i>) and babae (<i>D. russelli</i>) remained apparent at the fish port this week, sourced from Vietnam and China.</li> <li>3. The supply of alumahan (<i>Rastrelliger kanagurta</i>) remained unpredictable at the Navotas Fish Port Complex this week, as only one (1) broker unloaded the commodity on March 15, 2024, with an actual wholesale price of Php 220.00/kg, sourced from Bataan.</li> <li>4. Adequate volumes of medium-sized bangus (<i>Chanos chanos</i>) were observed at the fish port this week. Likewise, supplies of medium-sized tilapia (<i>Oreochromis niloticus</i>) continued to be sufficient, chiefly from Batangas and Pampanga.</li> <li>5. Major source areas of the top fishery commodities in the monitored wholesale market are as follows: <ul> <li>a. Bangus -Bulacan</li> <li>b. Tilapia - Batangas</li> <li>c. Local Galunggong-Zambales</li> <li>d. Alumahan- Bataan</li> <li>e. Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
