The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), sufficient unloading of marine fishery commodities was observed this week. Commodities recorded were sapsap, lapad, kabase, tamban, dilis, tambakol, espada, dalagang bukid, lapu-lapu, tulingan, labahita, linatsay, and others. These supplies were sourced from West Philippine Sea, Mindoro, Quezon Province, Visayan Sea, etc. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), the majority of the available supplies were small-sized chiefly from Northern Palawan, Masbate, Bicol and Zambales. Nonetheless, medium-sized commodities were available at prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00/kg and Php140.00/kg. Other variants like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*), and burot (*D. kurroides*) was also recorded.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 2. Despite the steady availability of local galunggong, supplies of medium to large-sized imported- frozen galunggong continued to be apparent in Navotas Fish Port this week.
- 3. For aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- 4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia Batangas, Pampanga
 - c. Local galunggong- Masbate, Bicol, Palawan, Zambales
 - d. Alumahan Bataan
 - e. Imported galunggong Vietnam, China
