Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Despite the occurrence of full moon on 25 March 2024, sufficient quantities of marine fishery commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port Complex and among the monitored retail markets this week. Commodities recorded were dalagang bukid bilog, bisugo, lapu-lapu, kitang, samaral, saramulyete, talakitok, labahita, and others. These supplies were sourced Mindoro, Zambales, Samar, Masbate, etc.
- Ample supplies of local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were still unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Supplies were mainly sourced from Palawan and Zambales. The prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized local galunggong remained at relatively low price of Php130.00/kg. There were other variant of local galunggong like burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) and balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*) also observed.
- For imported-frozen galunggong, there were still supply available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong was at Php120.00/kg sourced from China and Vietnam.
- Same prevailing wholesale prices were noted for bangus and tilapia at Php120.00 and 140.00/kg and Php90.00/kg, respectively, this week. This may be due to the adequate and stable supply at the said fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
