Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of March:

- Adequate supply of fresh marine commodities were still observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the month. Relatively, ample availability of local fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was recorded sourced from various areas including Palawan, Mindoro, Zambales, and Bicol. Nonetheless, other variants like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*), and burot (*D. kurroides*) was also recorded.
- Even so, sufficient unloadings of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and babae (*D. russelli*) was noted at the fish port this month, derived from Vietnam and China. This may be attributed to the existing demand for the imported commodity wherein some vendors opted to purchased imported-frozen galunggong due to its uniform sizes as compared with local-fresh galunggong.
- Meanwhile, unloading of alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*) remained unpredictable at Navotas Fish Port Complex this month.
- Adequate volumes of medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) sourced from Bulacan and Pangasinan were also observed at the fish port this month. Likewise, supplies of medium-sized tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) continued to be sufficient, chiefly from Batangas and Pampanga.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local-fresh galunggong - Zambales and Palawan
 - Imported-frozen galunggong - Vietnam, China
 - Alumahan- Bataan

(**) - Actual Wholesale - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring
