Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Overall, sufficient volumes of marine fishery commodities were noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.
- For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), abundant volume of supplies were still reported at the Navotas Fish Port this week. According to vendors, many unloadings were observed due to the good weather condition resulting to a relatively low prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00/kg this week. Supplies were mainly sourced from Palawan and Zambales. Other variant of local galunggong like burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) and balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*) were also noted.
- Despite the abundant supplies of local-fresh galunggong at the said fish port, there were still supply of imported-frozen galunggong available. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was at Php110.00/kg sourced from China and Vietnam.
- For aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, steady availability of the aforementioned commodities were still observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. Nonetheless, some of the fish vendors decreased their selling prices of bangus and tilapia to compete with the marine commodities.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
