Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, adequate unloading of fresh marine commodities was noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Meanwhile, a slight decrease in the availability of unloaded fishery commodities was noted at the wholesale level, possibly due to the occurrence of a bright moon on April 23, 2024, wherein fishes tends to scatter, making them harder to catch. However, stable and sufficient unloading of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was still observed at the fish port. The recorded prevailing wholesale price was Php120.00 & 130.00/kg. These supplies were sourced from Zambales, Batangas, and Northern Palawan. Other variants of the commodity like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*) and burot (*D. kurroides*) were also reported.
- Despite the continuous availability of local galunggong variants, medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and galunggong babae (*D. russelli*) imported from China and Vietnam were still observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. The recorded prevailing retail prices were Php110.00 & 125.00/kg and Php80.00/kg, respectively.
- Minimal unloading of medium-sized alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*) was observed at the Navotas Fish Port this week. As recorded, only one broker unloaded the commodity from Bataan at an actual wholesale price of Php180.00/kg.
- For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), constant availability was observed in the Navotas Fish Port this week. Consequently, no major changes in the prevailing wholesale price of both commodities were recorded.
- Major source areas of the top fishery commodities in the monitored wholesale market are as follows:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong- Zambales, Batangas
 - Alumahan- Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
