**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Sufficient volume of fresh marine commodities were noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be due to the good weather condition for the previous weeks.
- For local-fresh galunggong, abundant supplies of local-fresh galunggong were still unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Supplies were mainly sourced from Palawan and Zambales. Other variant of local galunggong like burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) and balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*) were observed at the fish port.
- Despite the abundance of local galunggong, imported-frozen galunggong remained available at the said fish port. Most of the buyers still prefer local than imported. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was at Php110 & 125/kg, sourced from China and Vietnam.
- For aquaculture commodities like bangus (*Chanos chano s*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), no changes were noted in the prevailing wholesale prices of medium-sized commodities at Php130/kg and Php 80 & 90/kg, respectively, this week. This may be due to the sufficient and stable supplies unloaded at the fish port. According to vendors, some of them decrease their selling price to compete for the price of marine commodities which is lower this time of the year.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
  - Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
  - Alumahan- Palawan, Bataan
  - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
