Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), adequate unloading of marine fishery commodities was observed this week. Commodities recorded were sapsap, lapad, kabase, tamban, dilis, tambakol, espada, dalagang bukid, lapu-lapu, tulingan, labahita, linatsay, and others. These supplies were sourced from West Philippine Sea, Mindoro, Quezon Province, Visayan Sea, etc. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), ample availability of supply was recorded from Northern Palawan, Zambales and Batangas. The recorded prevailing wholesale price for medium sized galunggong was Php120.00/kg and Php140.00/kg. Other variants like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*), and burot (*D. kurroides*) was also recorded.
- Despite the steady availability of local galunggong, supplies of medium to large-sized imported- frozen galunggong continued to be apparent in Navotas Fish Port this week.
- For aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Masbate, Bicol, Palawan, Zambales
 - Alumahan - Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
