Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- In general, minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) on the early part of the week but increased during the later part of the week due to the good weather condition. Among the commodities recorded were bisugo (*Nemipterus spp.*), sapsap, (*Leiognathus spp.*), labahita (*Acantharus spp.*), dalagang bukid (*Caesio caerulea*), batalay (*Tylosorus spp.*), and others.
- For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), four (4) brokers unloaded the commodity from Zambales and Northern Palawan with recorded prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00/kg on June 4. There were other variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*), chiefly sourced from Northern Palawan, also reported in the fish port.
- Imported-frozen galunggong remained available despite the sufficient supply of local galunggong at Navotas fish port. Buyers still prefer local than imported. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was at Php120 & 125/kg, sourced from China and Vietnam.
- Same prevailing wholesale prices for medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) at Php105-130/kg and Php 90 & 100/kg, respectively due to the stable and sufficient supply unloaded at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
