**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- An ample availability of fresh marine commodity was observed this week. Amongst most common commodities recorded are sapsap, lapad, kabase, tamban, dilis, tambakol, espada, dalagang bukid, lapu-lapu, tulingan, labahita, linatsay, and others. These supplies were sourced primarily from West Philippine Sea, Mindoro, Quezon Province, Visayan Sea, Bataan, Batangas, Northern Palawan and Zambales. Consequently, for local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), adequate availability of supply was still recorded from Northern Palawan, Zambales and Batangas. The recorded prevailing wholesale price for medium sized galunggong was Php120.00/kg. Other variants like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*), and burot (*D. kurroides*) was also recorded.
- Despite the steady availability of local galunggong (*D. macrosoma*), supplies of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong continued to appear in Navotas Fish Port this week.
- On the other hand for aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
  - Local galunggong- Masbate, Bicol, Palawan, Zambales
  - Alumahan - Bataan
  - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
