Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Lesser but still sufficient unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
- Five (5) brokers unloaded supplies of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were noted this week. Commodity were mostly sourced from Zambales and Northern Palawan. The recorded prevailing wholesale price was at Php120-155.00/kg. Higher prevailing prices were noted during the latter part of the week due to the decrease in the unloading of supplies caused by the rainy weather condition throughout the country. Other variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*), chiefly sourced from Northern Palawan, were also observed in the fish port.
- For imported-frozen galunggong, supplies remained available despite the availability of supply for local galunggong at Navotas fish port. According to vendors, buyers still prefer local than imported. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained at Php120 & 125/kg, sourced from China and Vietnam.
- No changes were observed at the prevailing wholesale prices for medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) at Php115-130/kg and Php 90/kg, respectively. This may be due to the stable and sufficient supply unloaded at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- Bataan
 - Imported galunggong- Vietnam, China
