Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of June:

- An adequate unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month. Among the most common commodities recorded are sapsap, lapad, kabase, tamban, dilis, tambakol, espada, dalagang bukid, lapu-lapu, tulingan, labahita and linatsay. Specifically, available supply of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was noted, sourced from Zambales and Northern Palawan. Another variants of galunggong, like galunggong babae (*D. russelli*) and burot (*D. kurroides*), were also recorded.
- Continuous unloading of imported-frozen galunggong (*D. macrosoma*) and babae (*D. russelli*) noted at the fish port this month, this may be attributed to the existing demand for the imported commodity, wherein some vendors opted to purchase imported-frozen galunggong due to its lower price and uniform sizes compared with local-fresh galunggong.
- On the contrary, unloading of alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*) remained unpredictable at Navotas Fish Port Complex this month. In fact, only actual prices of the commodity were recorded for Weeks 1 and 2 and resumed its supply on Week 4 sourced from Bataan and Masbate.
- An ample supplies of bangus and tilapia were noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month. For medium-sized bangus, the prevailing wholesale price was Php130.00/kg. Unloadings of small (5-6 pcs/kg) and large-size (1-2 pcs/kg) bangus were also recorded, derived from Bulacan and Pangasinan. For medium-sized tilapia, the prevailing wholesale price was Php90.00/kg, sourced from Batangas and Pampanga.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local-fresh galunggong - Zambales and Palawan
 - Imported-frozen galunggong - Vietnam, China
 - Alumahan- Bataan, Masbate
