Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Sufficient unloading of marine fishery commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) on the early part of the week but decreased during the later part of the week due to the continuous rainy weather conditions brought by Typhoon Aghon in the country.
- For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), six (6) brokers unloaded the commodity from Zambales and Northern Palawan with recorded prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00/kg on May 21 and 24. Another variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*), chiefly sourced from Northern Palawan, were also reported in the fish port.
- There were still available imported-frozen galunggong despite the sufficient supply of local galunggong at the said fish port. Buyers still prefer local than imported. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was at Php125/kg, sourced from China and Vietnam.
- No changes were noted in the prevailing wholesale prices of medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) at Php110-130/kg and Php 80 & 85/kg, respectively. This may be due to the stable and sufficient supply unloaded at Navotas Fish Port. According to fish vendors, some of them decrease their selling price to compete for the price of marine commodities which is lower this time of the year due to abundance of supply.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
