Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- For this week, minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). Some of the other commodities recorded were sapsap, lapad, bagaong, silinyase, bitilya, dalagang bukid, labahita, tamban, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*), five (5) brokers unloaded supplies this week. Most of the supplies were sourced from Northern Palawan and Zambales. The recorded prevailing wholesale price was at Php130.00/kg. Other variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) were also observed in the fish port.
- There were still available supplies of imported-frozen galunggong recorded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). However, most of the buyers still prefer the local than imported form of the said commodity. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained at Php120/kg, derived from China and Vietnam.
- Same prevailing wholesale prices for medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) were reported at Php110 & 115/kg and Php 95/kg, respectively. Supplies remained stable and sufficient supply unloaded at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
 - Alumahan- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong- Vietnam, China
