**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- An ample supplies of fresh marine commodities were reported at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.
- Adequate volume of supplies were unloaded for local-fresh galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*) at the fishport this week. The prevailing wholesale price was Php113-160/kg and most of the supplies were sourced from Northern Palawan and Zambales. Other variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) were observed in the fish port.
- For imported-frozen galunggong, supplies remained available despite the sufficient supply of local galunggong. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained at Php115/kg, sourced from China and Vietnam.
- The prevailing wholesale prices for medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) was still at Php130/kg and Php 90/kg, respectively. This may be due to the stable and sufficient supplies unloaded at Navotas Fish Port this week.
- Supply of shellfish commodities (e.g., tahong, talaba, and halaan) were limited, which may have been associated with the oil spill incident in Bataan.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
  - Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
  - Alumahan- Northern Palawan, Masbate
  - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
