Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. Stable availability of fresh marine commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Pelagic finfishes such as yellow fin (*Thunnus albacares*), tulingan lapad (*Auxis thazard*), tambakol (*Katsuwonus pelamis*) and others were observed. However, market vendors reported that there is low demand for fresh marine commodities this week, probably, still because of the Bataan oil spill incident.
2. Adequate availability of medium sized local-fresh galunggong-lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was recorded this week.
3. On the other hand, unloading of imported galunggong lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and galunggong babae (*D. russelli*) were recorded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). The actual wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was Php125.00/kg while Php85.00/kg & Php90.00/kg was recorded for imported-galunggong babae.
3. For alumahan (*Rastrilliger kanagurta*), no recorded supplies were seen this week. This is likely due to the fishing ban in Bataan following the oil spill incident, as Bataan is one of the major source areas for this commodity at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
4. For aquaculture commodities bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), stable unloading of supply was still recorded this week.
5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - c. Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
 - d. Alumahan- NA
 - e. Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
