Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Due to Typhoon Carina disrupting fishing activities in Southern parts of Luzon and most of the Region in the country, a decrease unloading of captured marine commodities was observed in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
- With this, limited supply of local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was recorded this week.
- In relation, limited display of local-fresh galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*), was recorded this week. The recorded actual wholesale price of medium-sized variety was at Php140.00/kg & Php148.00/kg sourced from Zambales and Zamboanga.
- On the other hand, adequate unloading of imported variants of galunggong (*D. macrosoma*) and (*D. russelli*) were recorded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki was Php120.00/kg & Php130.00/kg while Php85.00/kg was noted for imported-galunggong babae, both were derived from China and Vietnam.
- For aquaculture commodities bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), stable unloading of supply was still recorded this week. There still no major reports affecting the prevailing retail price of bangus despite the occurrence of Typhoon Carina. However for tilapia, forced harvesting were reported in Batangas due to rising water level in their fish cages and pens which could be the reason why their is an adequate availability of tilapia despite of the occurrence of Typhoon Carina.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Palawan
 - Alumahan- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
