Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- An adequate supplies of fresh-marine commodities were noted at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among these commodities recorded were tulingan bilog, matambaka, yellow-fin tuna, and other small pelagic fishes.
- For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), sufficient volume of supplies were unloaded at the fishport. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php130.00/kg and most of the supplies were sourced from Batangas and Northern Palawan. Other variant of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*) were also observed in the fish port.
- On the otherhand, supplies of medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki were still observed despite the availability of local fresh galunggong at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Most of the buyers still prefer the local variant than imported. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained at Php120/kg, sourced from China.
- No changes in the prevailing wholesale prices of medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) sold at Php130/kg and Php 90 & 100/kg, respectively. According to vendors, the supplies remained stable and sufficient at Navotas Fish Port.
- Supply of shellfish commodities (e.g., tahong, talaba, and halaan) were limited, which may have been associated with the oil spill incident in Bataan.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored wholesale market/s are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Batangas, Palawan
 - Alumahan- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China
