**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- Limited unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week, likely due to hampered fishing operations caused by Severe Tropical Storm "Enteng," which affected most parts of the country from September 1-4, 2024. However, the supply of local fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was still noted. On September 6, 2024, five brokers unloaded this commodity, recording a prevailing wholesale price of Php 155.00/kg sourced from Northern Palawan. Additionally, large-sized galunggong was also observed, sourced from Zamboanga.
- Despite the supply of local galunggong variants, continuous unloading of imported frozen galunggong was recorded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). The prevailing wholesale price for imported frozen galunggong lalaki was Php 125.00/kg, while imported galunggong babae was noted at Php 90.00/kg, with both sourced from China.
- Meanwhile, only one broker unloaded medium-sized alumahan (*Rastriliger kanagurta*) this week, with a recorded wholesale price of Php 206.00/kg sourced from Northern Palawan.
- No major changes were observed in the prevailing prices of medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chano s*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) this week at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), where the supply remained stable and adequate.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan
  - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
  - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
  - Alumahan- Northern Palawan
  - Imported galunggong - China

*Note: No price monitoring activity was conducted on September 3, 2024, due to work suspension caused by the effects of Tropical Storm 'Enteng'.*
