Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- With the recent impact of severe Tropical Storm "Enteng," high prices remained the same from last week. This may be due to fisherfolk and wholesalers recovering from the storm's effects on their livelihoods. Despite this, a gradual increase in volume of unloaded fishery commodities was observed, specifically on September 13 at 539.1 metric tons as compared to last week on September 6 at 429.23 metric tons. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) minimal but sufficient supply was recorded sourced from Palawan, with the recorded prevailing wholesale price of Php160.00/kg. Other variants of galunggong, such as babae (*D. russelli*) and burot (*D. kurroides*), were also noted.
- Despite the steady availability of local-fresh galunggong, supplies of medium to large-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and (*D. russelli*) still recorded in Navotas Fish Port this week at Php125.00/kg and Php90.00/kg & Php120.00/kg, respectively.
- For aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Laguna, Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Palawan
 - Alumahan - Bicol, Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China
