Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, minimal but sufficient unloading of fresh-marine commodities was observed this week, following the occurrence of Super Typhoon Pepito on November 15-18 affecting fishing operations on most part of Luzon as well as in Visayas. Despite this, gradual recovery of the volume of supply was observed on November 22, could be due to better weather condition compared from previous days. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), minimal availability of medium-sized of the commodity was observed today at increased prevailing wholesale price of Php160.00/kg to Php220.00/kg sourced from Palawan and Zambales.
- Availability of medium to large-sized imported- frozen galunggong continued to be apparent in Navotas Fish Port this week.
- Meanwhile for alumahan (*Rastrilleger kanagurta*), three brokers unloaded this commodity sourced from Zamboanga, Quezon Province, and Palawan at actual price ranging from Php75.00/kg to Php200.00/kg. Price difference varied depending on the size and quality of the unloaded supplies.
- For aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Palawan, Zambales
 - Alumahan - Zamboanga, Quezon Province, Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam
