Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Minimal but sufficient availability of fresh-marine commodities was still observed this week following the colder weather conditions brought about by the Northeast monsoon "Amihan" and the shearline affecting the eastern section of Central Luzon. Additionally, the implementation of the closed fishing season in selected major fishing grounds, including Northern Palawan, the Visayan Sea, and the Zamboanga Peninsula, has affected the volume of fish landings at the Navotas fish port wholesale market.
- Despite this, sufficient supply of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong-lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was unloaded this week at prevailing wholesale price of Php200.00/kg, source from Zamboanga, Masbate, and Ilocos Norte.
- Compared last week, there was only one (1) broker recorded to unload medium-sized alumahan (*Rastriliger kanagurta*) at Navotas Fish Port wholesale market at actual wholesale price of Php145.00/kg this week, with supplies sourced from Ilocos Norte.
- For the major aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies remained consistently available at the Navotas fish port wholesale.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zamboanga, Zambales, Bicol
 - Alumahan - Ilocos Norte
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam
