Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Similar to the previous week, minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed at Navotas Fish Port wholesale market this week. This could be due to most of the fisherfolks and wholesalers from various source areas preferred not to sell this week following the Christmas holidays. Despite this, market vendors noted that the supply in the wholesale market might increase due to higher demand from buyers in preparation for the New Year celebrations on Wednesday. Consequently, for the medium-sized local-fresh galunggong-lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), actual retail price was still observed this week at Php160.00/kg & Php220.00/kg for medium-sized of the commodity, sourced from Zambales.
- Meanwhile for imported-frozen galunggong-lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and (*D. russelli*), continuous availability of this commodity were still observed at Navotas wholesale market at Php200.00/kg and Php170.00/kg, sourced from Vietnam.
- In relation to the limited availability of fresh-marine commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week, minimal unloading of medium-sized alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*) was observed at actual price of Php160.00/kg and Php180.00/kg, sourced from Bataan.
- For aquaculture commodities, maintained and sufficient availability of major aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) were still observed among the monitored retail markets today.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales
 - Alumahan - Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam
