Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- A limited supplies of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be due to the colder weather condition and advent of typhoons that directly affects the fishing activity in most of the major fishing grounds of the country.
- For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong laki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), minimal supplies were observed this week. The actual wholesale prices were recorded at Php160.00/kg and Php200.00/kg this week. Supplies were mostly sourced from Palawan, Zambales, and Zamboanga. There were other variants of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*), were also observed at the fish port.
- Higher volume of supply for imported-frozen galunggong was recorded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Most of the buyers prefer imported-frozen galunggong over local-fresh galunggong due to its affordability, which makes it easier to sell.
- For the supply of alumahan (*Rastrilleger kanagurta*) no unloadings were recorded this week, this might be due to the hampered fishing operations brought by different typhoons occurred in the country.
- For medium-sized bangus (*Chanos chanos*), supply remained stable and sufficient this week. This resulted in steady prevailing wholesale prices of Php130.00/kg. Most of the supplies were sourced from Laguna and Bulacan.
- No changes were observed in the prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized tilapia at Php115 & 120/kg this week. Supplies remained stable and sufficient this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan, Laguna
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Zamboanga
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
