Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas fish port wholesale market, a slight gradual return to normal volume but still minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities was observed this week following the holiday celebration from the last couple of weeks. Consequently, for the medium-sized galunggong-lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), eight [8] brokers were recorded to unload this commodity within two monitoring days this week. The recorded prevailing retail price today was Php200.00/kg, sourced from Zambales and Ilocos Coast.
- Despite slight increase availability of local galunggong, supplies of medium to large-sized imported- frozen galunggong continued to be apparent in Navotas fish port this week. The recorded prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong-lalaki (*D. macrosoma*) and babae (*D. russelii*) were Php130.00/kg and Php 88.00/kg & Php90.00/kg, respectively. Said supplies were sourced from Vietnam.
- Minimal availability of medium-sized alumahan (*Rastriliger kanagurta*), was still observed this week at Navotas fish port wholesale market. The recorded actual prices of this commodity was at Php170.00/kg and Php230.00/kg, sourced from
- For major aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Masbate, Bicol, Palawan, Zambales
 - Alumahan - Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
