Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Minimal but sufficient unloading of fresh-marine commodities was observed in Navotas fish port wholesale this week. Commodities recorded were dalagang bukid bilog, kabase, carpa, gulyasan, bitilya, labahita, hipong puti, and others. Meanwhile, for the medium sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), three (3) brokers unloaded this commodity on January 28 (tuesday), with the recorded prevailing retail prices ranging from Php180.00/kg to Php225.00/kg, sourced from Zambales, Baabac Strait, and Bataan.
- Despite slight increases in unloading of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong-lalaki (*D. macrosoma*), continuous unloading of its imported variant was still noted at the Navotas fish port wholesale market at Php180.00/kg and Php185.00/kg, sourced from Vietnam. Moreover, no unloading of imported frozen galunggong babae (*D. russelli*) was noted this week.¹
- Meanwhile, for major aquaculture commodities such as bangus (*Chanos chanos*) and tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*), supplies were consistently available at Navotas fish port wholesale. Regular unloading from the source areas for bangus in Bulacan and Pangasinan and for tilapia in Batangas and Pampanga supports the public's demand for this commodity.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Masbate, Bicol, Palawan, Zambales
 - Alumahan - Bataan
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam, China
