Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, minimal supplies were noted for fresh marine commodities unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may still be due to the cold weather brought about by "Amihan" (Northeast monsoon), which causes fish to swim deeper into the ocean, making them harder to catch. Additionally, the presence of a full moon - due to its bright illumination, may have affected the fishing activity.
- Limited supplies were observed for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) this week. This resulted to a higher prevailing wholesale price at Php250.00/kg this week. Supplies were mostly sourced from Zamboanga. There were other variants of local galunggong, such as galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*), were also observed at the fish port.
- Higher volume of supplies for imported-frozen galunggong¹ was recorded at Navotas Fish Port this week. Most of the vendor switched to sell imported-frozen due to the limited supply of the local variant.
- No unloading of supplies were recorded for alumahan this week.
- No changes were observed in the prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia due to the stable and sufficient supplies unloaded at the fish port. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php120.00 & 130.00/kg and Php100.00/kg this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan, Laguna
 - Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Zamboanga
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam

¹ Price data of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki were gathered through FIDSSD's price monitoring at Navotas Fish Port.
